Argumentative Writing Analysis Review

<u>Directions</u>: Working with one (or if necessary, two) other person(s) who read the same essay/article as you, review each answer about your essay/article. For each question that you go over together, answer the questions below. Do <u>not</u>, however, go back and change your answers on your original papers if you come to think you were incorrect—you'll simply address such concerns in the questions below.

1.	Write down the numbers of the questions in which you and your partner were in total agreement with one another. Write them in order.
2.	Write down the numbers of the questions in which you and your partner were not in total agreement with one another. You may have been <i>partially</i> <u>or</u> <i>not</i> at all in agreement. Write them in order.
3.	For each answer that you differed from one another, determine which of you had the better/stronger answer. Address each question in order, writing the number of the question and the name of the person whose answer is better.
4.	Finally, for each answer that you differed from one another, explain <u>why</u> you came to believe the person you stated above was, in fact, better/stronger/more correct than the other? Be thorough in your reasoning, and again, address each question in order.
