





It's the annual high school lock-in, and add to that a LAN party. All the normal lock-in events, plus fun gaming activities. Libraries Accelerating Learning Grant from the Ohio Department of Education

Madison Public Library is offering five different technology related learning experiences as a result of receiving an almost \$250,000 grant. These experiences are open to all students in grades 4-12, but priority is given to those attending Madison Local Schools. During the school year the classes are Tuesday-Friday for two consecutive weeks after school from 3-5 p.m. **Students are strongly encouraged to only sign up for experiences if they will be able to attend all eight days of that experience.** Students are also encouraged to attend more than one learning experiences this school year, but they are discouraged from attending the same experience more than once.





September 12-22 (not 9/18)

January 9-19 (not 1/15)

Students experiment with different aspects of art and music culminating in creating an original musical composition and displaying various art pieces in a small art show. This combined with conducting several science experiments and getting a brief introduction to coding round out this experience.




September 26-October 6 (not 10/2)

Students experiment with being in front of and behind the camera. However, what they create in class will only be seen by class participants and their families. Students plan, record, and edit two videos: an informational video and a Lego stop motion. In the podcasting portion, students make recordings of children's chapter books in the public domain.



January 23-February 2 (not 1/29)

Students challenge themselves in a typing and mouse intensive experience. They get to experiment with the coding language Python as well as do some block coding in Scratch with a Raspberry Pi. In the escape room, students practice their circuitry skills as well as coding.



November 28-December 8 (not 12/4)

This experience goes beyond basic Lego robotics. It is seeing how robots have become a part of everyday life in a variety of ways. Additionally, this is building and doing basic coding with a few different robots.



October 17-27 (not 10/23)

November 6-17 (not 11/7 and 11/13)

Utilizing equipment from the library's CreateSpace, students make a prototype product that they could sell. But more than that, students follow the entrepreneurial journey from creating a product, making a business plan, marketing the product, and ultimately trying to "sell" it to local business professionals.
